
WELCOME

Our special presenter, Captain Monique Williams will share her empowering journey as a 14-year-old mother raising her daughter while attending school and maintaining a relationship with her daughter's father. Monique will open up about her challenges and will inspire us with the choices she made to get her life on track. Monique believes that all people, regardless of their circumstances have the ability to overcome and achieve their goals.

Monique is currently the acting Captain at a female correctional institution for the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation. She has worked in corrections for over 20 years. Even in the walls of the prison, she has inspired women to change and overcome their challenges so that they can be successful. Monique serves as a mentor, community volunteer and guest speaker for governmental and community agencies. She enjoys helping people find their purpose, passion and place.

Monique is married with two teenage daughters and two adult children. Both of her older children followed in her footsteps working in the criminal justice system. Her son is graduating with his bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice and her daughter is a correctional officer.

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
